

1. Parents/Guardians are responsible for actively watching their children at all times.
2. It is recommended that all non-swimmers and children eight years old and younger wear a Coast Guard Approved - Class 3 Lifejacket or better at all times.
3. Sharing of pool lanes is possible if no empty lanes are available. Proper lane sharing etiquette should be observed making known you are entering the lane and swimming right to left counter clockwise.
4. Throwing debris, refuse or any foreign matter into the pool is prohibited.
5. Any unruly action such as dunking, pushing, or spitting in the pool is prohibited.
6. NO ONE UNDER AGE 10 is allowed in the pool area unless accompanied by an adult (16+).
7. Diving is prohibited in shallow end and sides of pool.
8. Prohibited from the pool and pool area are: soaps and cleaning agents of any kind. Also, animals, both domestic & wild, glass containers, tobacco and alcohol. Smoking is not allowed in the pool area.
9. All persons admitted into the pool are subject to inspection by the life guard or staff on duty for open cuts and sores and may be denied entrance for health reasons by the lifeguard.
10. All swimmers must wear a regular swimsuit at all times and showers must be taken before entering the pool.
11. Anyone distracting or interfering with the lifeguard on duty, disobeying instructions or any of the above listed rules will be subject to criminal penalty under the law (Chapter 5, Revised Ordinances, City of Concord).
12. Parents, Camp Counselors & Group leaders, are required to supervise the children in their group. Leaders are expected to help enforce all pool rules. Parents, leaders & counselors must be actively supervising children, standing on the pool deck, in proper swim attire, to watch and monitor the children in the pool that are in their care.

13. Children who are not completely toilet trained, must wear tight fitting rubber pants or disposable swim pants, i.e. "Little Swimmers."
14. Do not hang on, pull, lift, or remove the pool lanes. Facility staff alone should handle pool lanes.
15. Lifeguards and facility staff are authorized to expel any person from the pool premises for violation of any Pool Regulation or for just cause, and the violator is subject to prosecution under the law. Any person expelled from the pool must leave the facility immediately.
